33 HOOPSTERS INAUGURATE RHSAA TOURNAMENT

On Saturday, April 10, 2004, the RHSAA held its first alumni basketball tournament. Crystal Longwell (1989), RHSAA Vice President, organized the event. It was a double elimination affair with teams from four different eras participating – '76-'84, '85-'89, '90-'94, and '98-'03.

In the 10 a.m. tipoff game, '76-'84 and '85-'89 played a close match with '85-'89 pulling away in the last five minutes, winning 66-60. Scooter Tolzda and Phil Hulsey each scored 16 points for the winners. Rob Fuchs had 20 for the '85-'89 crew.

In game two, '98-'03 took on '90-'94. The youngsters prevailed, 62-54. Mike Gehrig led the victors with 16 points, while Doug Ladyga netted 12 for Team '90-'94.

In the afternoon round, '98-'03 played '85-'89. The battle of unbeatens saw '85-'89 winning 60-54. Jim Martin collected 14 for '85-'89 and Mark Isaly was the day's top scorer in one game with 30 in a losing effort.

'76-'84 met the youngest team, with the veterans winning 73-63. Scooter Tolzda had 27 for the vets vs. Mike Gehrig's 17 and Ethan Hulsey's 16.

In the championship game, Brian Taylor's dunk in the last 10 minutes sealed the game for '85-'89, who won 70-41. Craig Sebring led the winners with 24, while Brian Wisvari had 14 for '76-'84.

Overall high scorer was Scooter Tolzda with 60 points.

RHS FIELDHOUSE GETS A FACELIFT

Have you ever been in the fieldhouse at the RHS football stadium? If so, you know it needed some work!

During the summer of 2003, a Fieldhouse Committee of most of the present coaches at RHS started that badly needed task. The original fieldhouse in the RHS stadium was built in 1969. Another section was added on in the late 1980s. The building has never been remodeled or worked on.

The committee asked the RHSAA Board to consider contributing to the project. In turn, the RHSAA donated \$2,500. The funds were used for cleaning, painting, and purchase of weight equipment. Committee members, students, and other volunteers worked for several months during the summer of 2003 painting and cleaning the building. Weight equipment was purchased, including some made specifically for women. Every athlete on every sports team as well as all physical education classes, used the fieldhouse during 2003-04, according to Mike Flannery, RHS football coach.

What still remains to be done? The visitors' locker room needs to be cleaned and painted. About 40 new lockers are needed in the fieldhouse, which cost approximately \$300.00 each. Six new pieces of LAT pull-down weight equipment are needed, and each piece costs about \$1,200.00.

Mike Flannery encourages all alumni to visit the fieldhouse. The RHSAA is proud to support projects such as this that can improve the RHS facilities and activities.
